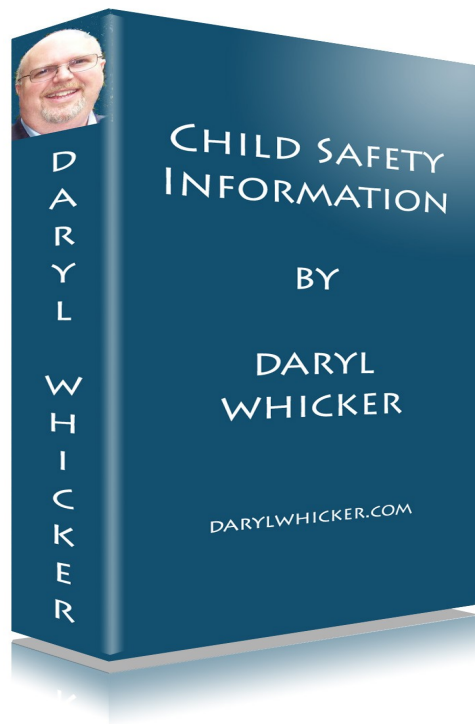

1. What are some of your concerns and challenge's about your children and teenager's safety?

So you're letting your child sleep over at one of his/hers friend's house over the weekend, not knowing everyone that lives there or anything about the mother or father and you find out the next day that your child is missing, molested, or dead.

What would you do? Have you ever thought that this could happen?

We **only** hear about the high profile cases in the news.

According to the FBI, over 800,000 children are reported missing in the U.S.A. every year.

There are over 716,750 registered sex offenders in the U.S.A. The majority have never been caught. Over 100,000 fail to register.

1 in 5 girls and 1 in 10 boys will be sexually victimized before they reach the age of 18. Only 1 in 3 will ever report it.

76% of abducted children are dead within the first 3 hours.
42% are dead within 1 hour.

These horrible statistics will continue to grow exponentially if we're not **proactive about our children and teens safety.**



2. Why haven't these challenges been resolved?

We depend on law enforcement when we report these tragic events and with the budget restraint's that law enforcement has it just leaves us all frustrated.



The Amber Alert is a great program but most children and teens don't qualify for an Amber Alert. **Certain criteria must be met.**

Summary of Department of Justice Recommended Criteria:

- There is reasonable belief by law enforcement that abduction has occurred...
- The law enforcement agency believes that the child is in imminent danger of serious bodily injury or death.
- There is enough descriptive information about the victim and the abduction for law enforcement to issue an AMBER Alert to assist in the recovery of the child.
- The abduction is of a child aged 17 years or younger.
- The Child's name and other critical data elements, including the Child Abduction flag, have been entered into the National Crime Information Center system.

As a parent you will need to make sure that law enforcement enters your child's information into the (NCIC) if your child becomes missing.

We can't depend on law enforcement because of their limited resources.

Law enforcement does a great job and **I commend them highly for their efforts** but they can't help it if they have limited funds in these areas.

As parents it's imperative that we're proactive in ensuring our child's safety. Your children are depending on you for their safety and well being.

Another factor that we have to deal with is, in over 90% of rape and molestation cases the child and parent knows the molester. It's usually someone that gains you and your child's trust.

Child molesters are cunning and very smart. Don't ever underestimate them.

3. What's possible when sharing safety tip's with your child?

When you were young and in school and you had a fire drill, did you ever get scared?



We were taught to stay calm and leave the building as if it were on fire. Our teachers didn't scare us to death and tell us that we would be burned up in the fire. They taught us what to do, and we practiced fire drills often.

Just the other day I heard of a great story about a two year old boy that was at his grandmother's house.

She was a diabetic and fell unconscious. The child's mother taught him 4 days before that: if someone's keeping you and they're non-responsive, call 911.

The little boy called 911 and his grandmother is alive today because of it.

Children are so calm and they do what they're taught. Most parents would panic in a situation like that.

84% of the time a child escapes abduction through their own actions.

Please take a few minutes each day to teach your child these life saving tips, it really does work...



4. What can you do to make a difference now?

Our children are our most precious possession. We will do whatever it takes to keep them safe and we will protect them at any cost. However we're not perfect and we often let our guard down, even for a few seconds, unfortunately that's all that is needed for a tragedy to occur to our children when we're not paying attention. Here are some safety tips for you to help reduce or eliminate the likelihood of such tragedies.

5. Teach your children these 25 Child Safety Tip's Today!

- If someone pulls over in their car and calls out for help or directions, teach your child to turn around and run in the opposite direction. If someone really needs help they can find an adult to help them.
- When your child is riding their bicycle, if someone grabs them, teach them to hold onto the handle bars tight and don't let go, no one can put you and the bike in the car at the same time.
- If your child is taken and put into a car tell them they can open the door and get back out or crawl over the seat and get out of the back door. The predator can't drive and try to grab your child at the same time.
- If your child is put into a trunk of a car, teach your child to pull the emergency trunk release strap that's in most newer cars. Parents show your child where this is in the trunk.
- You should also show your child how to kick out the tail light bulbs in the trunk or pull the brake lights and turn signals out of the socket. Law enforcement's trained to pull cars over when their tail lights and turn signals are not working properly.
- Children need a whistle so they can blow it if they are in a bad situation. Everybody will look. Anything to draw attention.
- Never go with anyone, anywhere until you get your parents' permission, even if you know them.
- If your child is ever out with their friends, teach them to always stick together and don't ever wander off, even if they get mad at their friends.
- If your child is home alone and someone knocks on the door or rings the door bell, teach them to **never** open the door, even if they know who it is.

- If you're out shopping with your child or anywhere else and someone comes up to your child and says to them that your mom or dad's hurt and I will take you to them, don't go with them even if you know them.
- Make sure your child knows their own unique code word. Do not share this word with anyone else. Each child should have their own code word. If it's an emergency the adult will know the code word. If the code word is ever used, change the code word to a new word that only you and your kid knows.
- If someone comes up to your child and says they've lost their puppy or kitten and ask them if they will help them find it. Tell them no and go tell a trusted adult and mom and dad. No one should ever need a child to help them do anything, if they really need help, they can find an adult to help them.
- Before entering your home if the door is unlocked or opened, do not go inside, turn around and leave immediately.
- If you ever enter your house and see someone you don't know, turn around and leave immediately.
- Teach your child to remember their full name, address and phone number with area code.
- Always have an emergency phone number where the school can reach you, in case someone tries to pick up your child or your child is absent from school.
- Make sure your child's school will not release your child to anyone unless you've authorized it.
- Take photographs of your child regularly (4 times per year).
- Never leave your child alone in a car. Someone with experience can break into your car in less than 30 seconds.

- Pay attention when someone is overly interested in your child. Find out why. Do not leave your child alone with them.
- Always know what your child is wearing. Note any birthmarks, visible scars etc...and write down such identifying marks. This way you won't forget them in an emergency.
- Be involved in your child's activities. Know your child's friends as well as their parents.
- Listen to your child. If your child tells you that he/she does not want to be with someone, ask your child direct questions to find out why and don't leave them alone with that person.
- Do not display your child's name on back packs, clothing, jackets etc...
- Be sensitive to changes in your child's behavior or attitude. Be alert to any talk from your child on sexual matters.

6. What should you do on a daily basis?

Very Important! Even though you practice these safety tips mentioned, review them on a regular basis and share them daily with your children and practice role playing with some "what if scenarios". Relate it to a fire drill.
